



ASA's 2020 Fall Data Challenge Dataset 101

About the Dataset

For *This is Statistics'* 2020 **Get Out the Vote Challenge**, all teams must utilize the IPUMS-ASA U.S. Voting Behaviors dataset (bit.ly/FDC_Dataset) in their entry.

This is a dataset about voting behavior in the U.S. over the past 14 years. It uses survey data from the Census Bureau and Department of Labor of Statistics that's collected on a sample of Americans every two years right after the November elections.

Demographic information is available for each respondent, including:

- Age
- Sex
- Race
- Ethnicity
- Marital status
- Military veteran status
- Size of community
- Employment status
- Educational background

There is also voting information for each respondent, including:

- Whether or not they were registered to vote
- If they were not registered, the reason why not
- Whether or not they voted in the most recent election
- If they didn't vote, the reason why not
- Whether they voted on Election Day or before, in person or by mail

Teams should review the complete codebook for detailed description of the variables.

Dataset Variable Terms Glossary

YEAR

year of the survey

STATEFIP

person's state of residence

METRO

type of metropolitan area person lives in

AGE

person's age at last birthday

SEX

person's self-reported sex

RACE

person's self-identified race

MARST

person's current marital status

VETSTAT

status as a veteran of the U.S. military forces

CITIZEN

status as native-born or naturalized citizen

HISPAN

details about Hispanic origin

LABFORCE

whether the person was in the labor force during the preceding week

EDUC99

person's highest level of educational attainment

EDCYC

number of years of college credit earned (for those with a college education but not a bachelor's degree)

EDDIPGED

completed an equivalency test such as the GED or not (for those who completed high school)

EDHGCGED

highest level of schooling attained (for those who did not complete high school)

SCHLCOLL

enrolled in high school or college or not (for those aged 16 to 24)

VOWHYNOT

reason for not voting (for those who were registered but did not vote in the most recent November election)

VOYNOTREG

reason for not registering to vote in the election (for those who were not registered)

VOTEHOW

whether the person voted in person or by mail (for those who voted)

VOTEWHEN

whether the person voted on election day or before (for those who voted)

VOREGHOW

how the person registered to vote (for registered voters)

VOTED

whether the person voted during the most recent election (for those who were registered)

VOREG

whether the person was registered to vote (for those who did not vote in the most recent election)

VOSUPPWT

the weight specific to the Voter Supplement

MARRSIMPLE, RACESIMPLE, HISPSIMPLE, EDUSIMPLE

simplified versions of MARST, RACE, HISPAN, and EDUC99
